FACILITY OVERVIEW

In the past it was thought that the driving range immediately north of this area may be the location of the former landfill. However, after reviewing historical aerials and US EPA documents it was determined that this was unlikely as no disturbance or filling was apparent in any aerials dating back to the 1930's.

The landfill was operated by The General Electric (GE) Company's Aircraft Engines facility located on Neumann Way in order to dispose of some of the waste generated by the facility. The entire area believed to be the former landfill remained under ownership of GE until 2021 when several parcels were transferred to Port of Greater

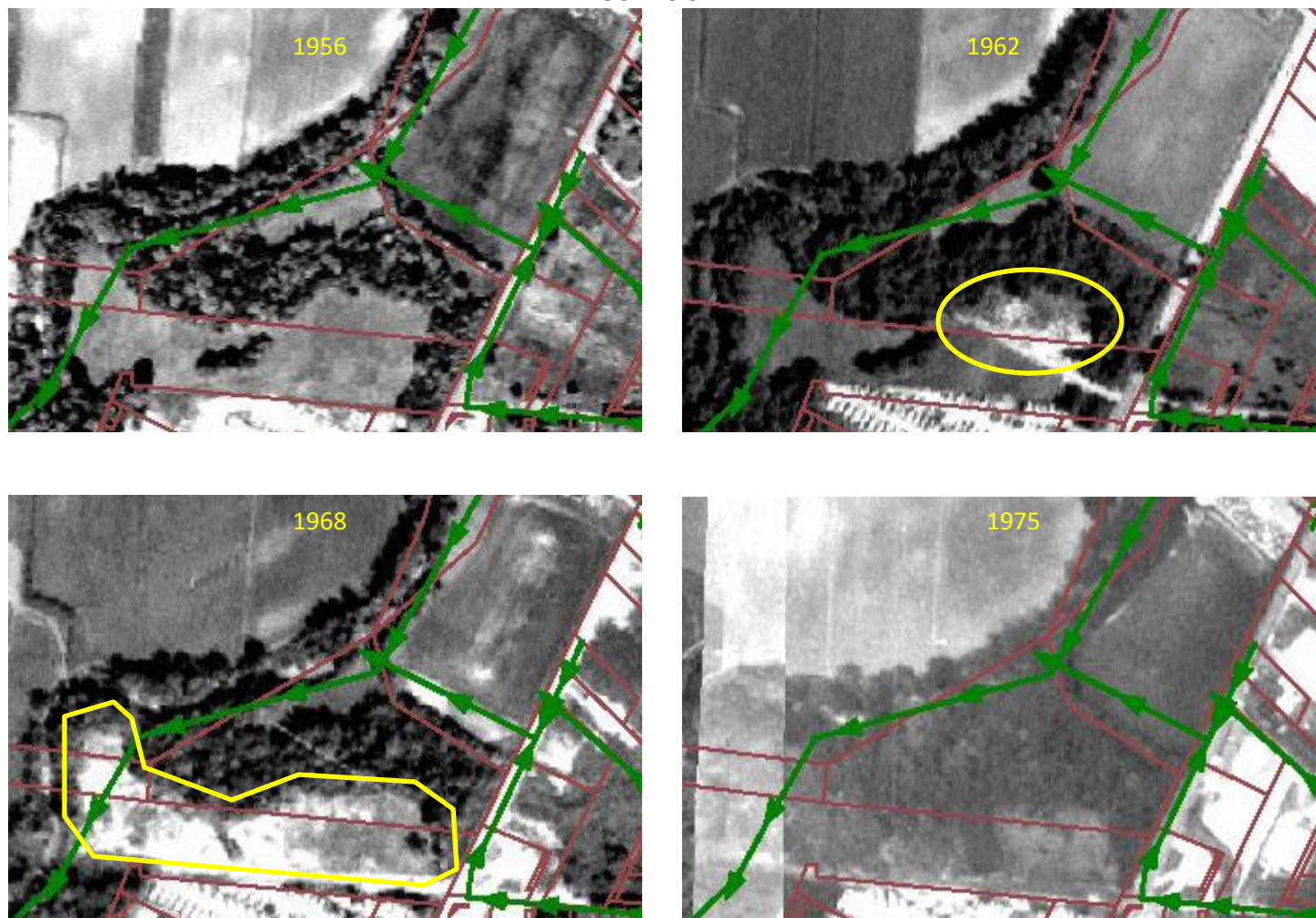


FIGURE 3.5.4-B

Cincinnati Development Authority. Figure 3.5.4-A shows the progression of filling at the former landfill. There was some evidence of possible filling, circled in yellow, on the eastern portion of the property in 1962 and on the whole site by 1968. In the aerial from 1975 it appears as though filling is no longer occurring. Additionally, an ODOT aerial from 1970, Figure 3.5.4-B, clearly shows filing occurring on the property.

3.11.2 SAMPLING RESULTS

No surface water sampling or explosive gas monitoring has been performed at this landfill.

3.11.3 SITE INSPECTIONS

The site was last inspected by HCPH on November 12, 2025. No violations or nuisance conditions were observed although access to the property is restricted via locked fencing.

3.11.4 SITE PRESENT DAY

The former landfill is wooded vacant land fenced in to restrict access. The photo below is a view of the wooded area from the intersections of Cooper Road and Reading Road.
